I can explain if I like or dislike music and say why.

I can use my knowledge of beat, repetition and rhythm to create a short dance.

I can explore different moves from the 80s and create a sequence of these moves.

Music: Listen to some 1980s music and make up your own dance routine or exercise workout to a song of your choice.

Examples: Survivor's 'Eye of the Tiger'

You could try and incorporate some iconic moves from the 1980's like;

Michael Jackson 'Moonwalk', the 'Sprinkler', the 'Robot' and the 'Running Man'.

I can explain the role a person in the past has had on modern day life.

I can take information and present it in a different way.

Fact File: You will find information about Steven Jobs below. Please read through the information and create a fact file i.e. Name, date of birth, job, their life etc.

You can use the fact file template to help you or create your own template to fill in.

I can place at least 2 events correctly on a simple timeline.

Timeline: There were some very significant historical events during the 1980s. The fall of the Berlin War (1989), the death of John Lennon (1980), the release of the personal computer (1981), the NASA Challenger disaster (1986), the first Nintendo (1985), the first mobile phone (1984), Motorola launching their mobile phone (1983) and the first artificial heart implanted (1982). Plot these events and any others you can add on a timeline. Be creative add pictures to illustrate your timeline!

First Level Topic The 1980s

Pick one or two activities to do each week. You have three weeks on this topic. If you can work with a sibling or friend, please do. If you want to or able to please share your work with your teacher!

I can discuss and explain my likes and dislikes about an 80s TV show. I can compare different aspects of TV shows then and now and explore reasons why/how things have changed

I can write a review to display my thoughts and opinions.

TV Review: Watch part of a classic children's television programme from the 1980s, there are lots to choose from on YouTube – Why Don't You, Blue Peter, Grange Hill, Fraggle Rock, Inspector Gadget, He-Man and the Masters of the Universe – or identify another with an adult in your household.

Write or video a review of the programme, what made it enjoyable, what did you not like, how does it compare to children's television today.

I can use my knowledge of a topic to create a new design. I can share my thoughts about fashion in the 80s.

Use these pictures and/or research more about the fashion in the 80s to create a picture of yourself in an 80s outfit. Do you have any 80s fashion clothes in your wardrobe?








I can compare life today with a time in the past.

Comparative Study: You are going to compare your life to an adult you know who grew up in the 1980s. Think of some categories you could compare such as school life, food, tv programmes, outdoor games and communication. Write 5 – 7 questions based on your categories. Arrange a time to interview your adult and record their answers in some way. Compare your life to theirs and record your findings in a way of your choosing e.g. poster, leaflet, venn diagram or spider diagram.

Steven Paul Jobs

Steven Paul Jobs was an American inventor, designer and entrepreneur who was the co-founder, chief executive and chairman of Apple Computer. Apple's revolutionary products, which include the iPod, iPhone and iPad, are now seen as dictating the evolution of modern technology.

Steve Paul Jobs was born in San Francisco, California on February 24, 1955. His birth parents gave him up for adoption and he was adopted by Paul and Clara Jobs. Paul was a machinist and Clara an accountant.



Jobs and Wozniak were both very interested in computers. Wozniak wanted his own personal computer and, being the electronics genius he was, he invented his own computer. Jobs was impressed. He said they should start their own company selling the computer and Wozniak agreed.

In 1976, they formed the company Apple Computer and called their first computer the Apple I. They began making the computers in Jobs' garage. Jobs was just 21 years old at the time. They funded their entrepreneurial venture by Jobs selling his Volkswagen bus and Wozniak selling his beloved scientific calculator.

Wozniak then started working on the next version called the Apple II. Jobs could tell that this was going to be a great product. He sold the idea to some investors convincing them to invest in the company. The Apple II was a great success. The company quickly grew and went public just four years after it started in 1980.

In 1980, Apple Computer became a publicly-traded company, with a market value of \$1.2 billion by the end of its very first day of trading.

In the following years, Apple introduced such revolutionary products as the Macbook Air, iPod and iPhone, all of which dictated the evolution of technology. In 2008, Apple became the second-biggest music retailer in America.

Over several years Jobs had some health issues. In 2003 he discovered that he had a neuroendocrine tumor. In 2009, it was reported that he had to have a liver transplant. A few years later, in January 2011 he announced he was going on medical leave.

Jobs died in Palo Alto on October 5, 2011, after battling pancreatic cancer for nearly a decade. He was 56 years old.
